Annotatsiya: Ushbu maqola ingliz tilidagi talaffuzni qo‘shiqlar orqali o‘rgatishning nazariy asoslarini o‘rganadi va ularning til o‘rganishdagi samaradorligini yoritadi. Theoretical frameworks, such as Krashen's Input Hypothesis and communicative language teaching approaches, support the use of songs as an effective tool for improving learners' phonetic awareness. Additionally, songs provide opportunities for learners to imitate, practice, and internalize pronunciation features subconsciously through melody and repetition.

Furthermore, integrating songs into pronunciation teaching addresses affective factors such as anxiety and motivation. Many learners feel self-conscious when practicing pronunciation, and traditional drills may cause stress or boredom. Songs, however, make learning more interactive and enjoyable, encouraging active participation and long-term retention of pronunciation patterns.

Stephen Krashen once stated, "Language acquisition occurs when learners are exposed to meaningful and comprehensible input" [2,34]. This idea directly supports the use of songs in teaching pronunciation. Songs provide authentic language input in a natural context, allowing learners to internalize stress, rhythm, and intonation subconsciously. By listening to and singing along with songs, learners receive repeated exposure to correct pronunciation patterns in an enjoyable and engaging way, which aligns perfectly with Krashen's Input Hypothesis.



Lev Vygotsky emphasized that “Learning is a social process that occurs through interaction with more knowledgeable others” [4,88]. In the context of using songs, this means that learners can benefit from collaborative activities such as group singing, call-and-response exercises, and peer feedback. Social interaction during musical activities encourages learners to practice pronunciation, imitate native-like sounds, and refine their speech while feeling supported by their peers.

Paula Winke noted, “Motivation is key to successful language learning, and music can increase learner engagement” [5,56]. Songs naturally motivate learners because they are enjoyable, memorable, and emotionally engaging. When students are motivated, they are more likely to participate actively in pronunciation exercises, repeat difficult sounds, and retain the patterns more effectively. Music thus becomes a tool that connects enjoyment with learning outcomes.

Michael Long argued, “Interaction provides opportunities for learners to notice and produce language features” [3,21]. Songs create contexts for learners to notice stress patterns, intonation, and connected speech. Through activities such as singing along, shadowing, or analyzing lyrics, learners actively produce language features, improving both their listening comprehension and oral production.

Jim Cummins observed, “Language development occurs when learners feel confident and supported” [1,45]. Songs reduce anxiety and create a low-stress environment, enabling learners to experiment with pronunciation without fear of mistakes. This supportive setting fosters self-confidence and encourages learners to take risks, which is crucial for acquiring accurate pronunciation.

These theoretical perspectives collectively highlight that songs are not merely an entertaining activity but a powerful pedagogical tool. They integrate meaningful input, social interaction, motivation, focused attention on language features, and emotional support, all of which contribute significantly to improving English pronunciation in a classroom setting. Teaching English pronunciation through songs



combines theoretical insights from linguistics, pedagogy, and psychology with practical classroom strategies. Songs provide learners with authentic and meaningful input, allowing them to internalize stress, rhythm, intonation, and connected speech naturally. The approach aligns with Krashen's Input Hypothesis, Vygotsky's socio-cultural theory, and other motivational frameworks, highlighting the importance of comprehensible input, social interaction, and emotional engagement. Music engages learners, reduces anxiety, and encourages active participation, making the learning process enjoyable and memorable. Songs also support repetition and imitation, which are crucial for accurate pronunciation development. By integrating listening, singing, and phonetic analysis activities, teachers can create a learner-centered environment that enhances both listening and speaking skills.

Overall, using songs is an innovative, effective, and motivating method that not only improves pronunciation but also strengthens overall language competence, engagement, and confidence in English learners.

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
