



MODERN TOOLS AND TEACHING TECHNIQUES FOR EFFECTIVE SECOND/FOREIGN LANGUAGE TEACHING

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Abstract: Nowadays, the demand for learning foreign languages and achieving language proficiency has been increasing significantly. Therefore, this study aims to explore more modern tools and effective teaching techniques that contribute to improving the process of second/foreign language teaching and learning. The study is based on the analysis of relevant literature and highlights the importance of integrating digital technologies, interactive activities, and learner-centered approaches into language education. The findings indicate that the use of modern tools and effective teaching techniques can increase learners' motivation, participation, and overall language proficiency. Thus, innovative approaches play a significant role in enhancing the quality and effectiveness of second/ foreign language education.

In the modern era, the importance of foreign language learning has been increasing significantly. Young people are currently learning second or even multiple foreign languages, particularly English, due to its global significance. At present, various modern methods and tools are available for facilitating more effective language learning.

It can be argued that traditional language teaching methods mainly focus on the four essential skills: listening, writing, reading, and speaking, which are fundamental in developing overall language competence. In contrast, modern tools include videos, multimedia resources, and educational applications such as Quizlet, Kahoot, and Duolingo, which provide interactive and engaging learning experiences.

Each of these approaches has its own pedagogical value. For instance, in traditional classroom settings, students often work in groups or teams to complete tasks, discuss ideas, and collaboratively analyze their mistakes. This process promotes shared knowledge and peer learning. On the other hand, modern methods are increasingly oriented toward online and self-directed learning, where learners can independently study at home using digital platforms and applications.

Thus, both traditional and modern approaches play a complementary role in foreign language education, contributing to the development of learners' language skills and autonomy.

A natural question arises in foreign language teaching: among the various available methods and approaches, which one is the most effective for young learners? In this regard, the ideas of Brown (2007) are particularly relevant. According to him, effective language teaching is not limited to the transmission of linguistic knowledge; rather, it requires addressing learners' needs, interests, and individual differences. In other words, the primary focus of instruction should not only be on the teacher but also on the learner. By increasing learners' interest and motivation, more successful learning outcomes can be achieved.



However, in some language classrooms, teachers still follow a teacher-centered approach, where learners have limited opportunities to express their ideas or actively participate in the learning process. In such cases, the lesson is mostly dominated by the teacher's explanation, which may reduce learners' engagement and make it more difficult for them to internalize the new material. This idea is also supported by Nunan (2004), who emphasizes the importance of providing learners with opportunities to use the language meaningfully through tasks and active participation.

Another significant issue is the overreliance on traditional, paper-based teaching materials. In the context of rapid technological development, modern educational tools and digital resources play an essential role in enhancing learners' interest and engagement. Nevertheless, not all teachers actively integrate such tools into their classroom practice. Modern applications such as Kahoot, Quizlet, and other interactive platforms can make lessons more engaging and effective for learners of different age groups, including both younger and older students.

Harmer (2007) also highlights that well-planned lessons that integrate interactive and communicative activities significantly contribute to learners' language development. In addition, a comparative analysis of learners aged 18–19 and younger students shows that modern tools and effective techniques increase motivation and participation regardless of age. Therefore, it can be argued that when teachers carefully design their lessons and integrate both traditional and modern approaches, learners are more likely to develop deeper interest and achieve faster progress in foreign language learning.

The main aim of this study is to emphasize that, in the modern educational context, sufficient opportunities and resources are available for foreign language learning as part of personal development. However, it is essential that these opportunities are used effectively in order to foster learners' intellectual and personal growth. In this regard, Richards and Rodgers (2014) highlight that the primary focus



of modern language teaching should be on increasing learners' motivation and preparing them for real-life communication. This study also suggests that teachers should be provided with additional professional development courses. Although many teachers are highly qualified and experienced, some of their teaching methodologies remain traditional. Therefore, updating their pedagogical skills in line with modern educational trends would significantly improve the effectiveness of language instruction. Moreover, when teachers are able to engage learners appropriately, students tend to develop a stronger interest and emotional connection to the language. This can be illustrated by a personal teaching experience. A 14–15-year-old learner initially showed low motivation and limited interest in English, as she was more inclined towards learning the Korean language. However, after a period of interactive and motivating instruction, her attitude gradually changed. She later expressed that her interest in Korean had decreased, while her enthusiasm for English had increased. This demonstrates the effectiveness of appropriate teaching techniques, modern tools, and a balanced learner-centered and teacher-guided approach.

In conclusion, this study emphasizes that the effective integration of various teaching methods plays a crucial role in successful foreign language learning. In the context of modern education, learners have access to a wide range of both traditional and modern resources; however, the effectiveness of these resources largely depends on how they are applied in the classroom. Therefore, a balanced combination of traditional approaches and modern educational tools is essential for achieving meaningful learning outcomes.

The study also highlights that language learning should not be limited to memorization or passive knowledge acquisition. Instead, it should actively involve learners in communicative, interactive, and meaningful tasks that promote real-life language use. In this regard, teacher–student collaboration becomes a key factor in



creating an effective learning environment where learners feel motivated, confident, and engaged.

Furthermore, it can be concluded that teacher development is equally important in improving the quality of language education. Continuous professional training and exposure to modern pedagogical approaches enable teachers to update their methodologies and adapt to changing educational demands. When teachers successfully combine innovative tools with appropriate teaching techniques, learners are more likely to develop both linguistic competence and communicative confidence.

Overall, this study supports the view that a well-balanced, learner-centered, and technologically enriched approach significantly enhances the effectiveness of second/foreign language teaching and learning.

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
