Additionally, more than 200 languages have become extinct in recent generations, and thousands are at risk of disappearing by the end of the century .

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Research indicates that languages with fewer than 10,000 speakers are particularly vulnerable. In fact, the majority of endangered languages fall into this category, making them highly susceptible to extinction due to demographic pressures. Some predictions suggest that up to half of the world's languages may disappear by 2100 if current trends continue.

Language loss has far-reaching implications beyond communication. Scholars argue that each language encodes unique worldviews, ecological knowledge, and cultural practices. Therefore, the extinction of a language results in the irreversible loss of human knowledge and cultural diversity.

UNESCO highlights that endangered languages are closely tied to cultural identity and intellectual heritage, meaning their disappearance threatens not only linguistic diversity but also human diversity as a whole.
