

## STYLES OF LEADERSHIP AND THEIR IMPACT ON TEAM PERFORMANCE

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### **Annotatsiya:**

Ushbu maqolada zamonaviy tashkilotlarda qo'llaniladigan turli yetakchilik uslublari va ularning jamoa samaradorligiga ta'siri keng qamrovda tahlil qilinadi. Avtoritar uslub esa tezkor qaror qabul qilish imkonini bersada, uzoq muddatli motivatsiya va ish qoniqishiga salbiy ta'sir ko'rsatishi mumkin. Tranzaksion yetakchilik aniq vazifalar va rag'batlantirish tizimi mavjud bo'lgan sharoitlarda samarali hisoblanadi. Shuningdek, maqolada vaziyatga moslashuvchan yetakchilik muhimligi ta'kidlanadi, ya'ni har bir sharoitda yagona uslub samarali bo'lavermaydi. **Аннотация:**

Делается вывод о том, что гибкость руководителя, высокий уровень эмоционального интеллекта и стратегическое мышление являются основными факторами повышения эффективности команды и устойчивого развития организации.
