Post-listening Stage

Learners engage in follow-up activities such as summarizing the story, discussing characters, retelling events, or role-playing. These activities reinforce listening comprehension and integrate speaking and vocabulary practice.

Such structured use of YouTube stories transforms passive watching into active learning.

Discussion and Observed Outcomes

Based on classroom observations and teaching practice, learners who regularly engage with story-based YouTube content demonstrate noticeable improvement in listening comprehension.
