**7. Blended Learning** . Blended learning combines face-to-face instruction with online learning. This hybrid model allows flexibility, accessibility, and varied learning resources. It also enables teachers to track learner progress using digital

platforms (Graham, 2013). 8. Collaborative and Peer Learning . Collaborative learning emphasizes group activities where students work together to achieve learning goals.
